



Springvale Revitalisation Project: Springvale Road Boulevard



Local children participate in community consultation

Step 1

Students were introduced to the Springvale Road Boulevard Project and discussed the concept of streetscapes and what streetscapes include. These conversations were supported by an aerial photograph of Springvale Road Boulevard. These tasks were undertaken by the school one week prior to the workshop.



Step 2

On the day of the workshop two groups of students walked the east and west sides of Springvale Road and were asked to observe their likes and dislikes.

Step 3

Students undertook two activities using writing and drawing to describe their likes and dislikes and their consideration for elements they felt should remain and those that should be removed or changed through the upgrade.



Step 4

As a whole group students shared the summary of likes and dislikes and their observations were categorised and prioritised.



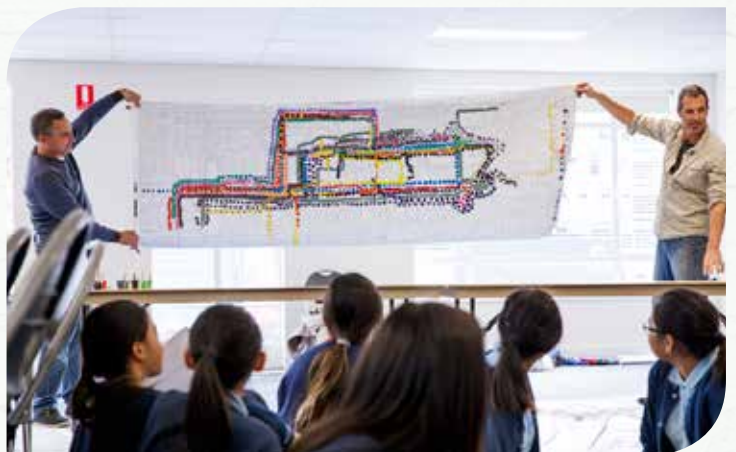
Step 5

Students were then invited to participate in an activity to give an understanding of how they move through the activity centre with their families. Each student used coloured paint to track their movement on an aerial image of Springvale Road Boulevard.



Step 6

Students were thanked for their participation and will be kept informed of the project as it progresses.



Step 7

The students work was documented and given to the design team for important consideration during the design phase of the project and for future planning for changes to public places and spaces in the municipality.
