OPEN SPACE IN KEYSBOROUGH

Keysborough with its newer areas of residential development is well serviced with public parks and reserves, with 151 hectares comprising of 47 parks. The number of parks will increase as the Keysborough South residential area continues to develop.

The Dingley Arterial regional bike trail connects Keysborough to Springvale South and Dandenong. It provides an important connection to the Dandenong Creek and Eastlink Regional Bike trails and to Keysborough's large open space network including Coomoora Reserve and Tatterson Park. The Keysborough South open space within the newer residential area is characterised by linked corridors of linear open space and wetlands incorporating shared path trails, playgrounds and bbq picnic facilities and remnant River Red Gums. Tatterson Park is an important 48 hectare district park located on Cheltenham Road with a strong environmental sustainability focus on water and conservation. The park includes the Springers Leisure Centre and has a 20 hectare woodland in the centre, three sportsgrounds, a regional playground themed around a 'World of Insects' and extensive wetlands and walking tracks.

Other larger public parks of significance to Keysborough are Frederick Wachter Reserve, Roth Hetherington Reserve, Coomoora Reserve and Coomoora Woodland Flora and Fauna Reserve. Coomoora Woodland is important ecologically to the municipality, being home to a number of threatened bird and fauna species. It is used for a range of passive recreational pursuits including bushwalking and local school community groups studying biodiversity. There are a number of smaller neighbourhood and local parks distributed throughout the residential area which provide a range of open space options for Keysborough residents.
