OPEN SPACE IN SPRINGVALE SOUTH

Springvale South contains 52 hectares of public open space comprising 16 parks, which are a mix of passive parks, sports reserves, a conservation reserve and a dog off leash area. The Dingley Arterial regional bike trail connects Springvale South to the broader open space network of Keysborough, in particular Coomoora Reserve and Tatterson Park. Burden Park is an important district park, highlighted by the timber adventure playground which has a rich community history. Council has recently upgraded the playground with new equipment and activities. Burden Park also provides sheltered bbq and picnic facilities, tennis and lawn bowls clubs. Alex Wilkie Nature Reserve is a valuable educational and cultural resource, where the environmental heritage of the local area is preserved for everyone to experience and enjoy. The 2.56 hectare site of heathland is one of the last remaining examples within the city of the vegetation that once covered the whole sand belt area in and around Springvale South. Guided walks are arranged by Council's Bushland Management Officers to learn more about the indigenous plants and wildlife that live there. Spring Valley Reserve is the largest park, providing the biggest dog off leash area, along with walking paths, playground and bbq facilities.
